KultureCity: Sensory Accessibility and Inclusion Published online October 16, 2021

Summary: KultureCity is a non-profit organization that certifies public places as accessible and Sensory Inclusive[™] by providing sensory areas and training staff how to recognize sensory sensitivities of individuals with invisible disabilities including autism and PTSD

- Taking *awareness* to the next steps of <u>acceptance and then</u> <u>inclusion</u> is really what is so important about what KultureCity does
- KultureCity <u>makes it possible</u> for sensory sensitive people to attend public venues and events such as music festivals
- With KultureCity training, <u>the onus is not placed on the individual</u> with the invisible disability, but on society to include everyone
- KultureCity also has Sensory Activation VEhicles (S.A.V.E.) that act as <u>mobile sensory rooms</u> at outdoor events and portable sensory kits for students at home doing online schooling
- KultureBall and KCFit are <u>fundraising events</u> held throughout each year involving high-profile names like the band *Imagine Dragons*
